

Lastly, I would like to thank all the coaches, athletic directors, writers and advertisers without their help this book would not be here today.



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

# The Coach is gone

### A tribute to Jay Swegarden

Jay Swegarden, the Beulah Miners' wrestling coach, lost a long battle with cancer at the age of 42. His battle, like his life, was an inspiration to those who knew him. "He fought to the very end. Even when he was in hospice care, he still refused to let the cancer take over, even though his suffering was unbelievable," said Rex Wenko, Beulah's athletic director.

"He refused to quit planning things. He made a tape that will be played at his funeral, thanking the community,"
Wenko said. "He refused to quit."

Swegarden took over a struggling wrestling program in 1990, six years after he moved to Beulah with his wife, Janelle, to teach language arts. Less than twenty kids were interested in the sport then. But with Swegarden to inspire the kids and lead the way, the numbers grew, and for the past several years Beulah has consistently ranked among the top five teams in the state.

"The program flourished," said Wenko. "I've been in this business a long time and some coaches just have a magnetism and a commitment to kids. This kids just pick up." Swegarden also became head football coach from 1991. He gave up the team two years ago to direct his energy toward wrestling and his battle against cancer. Last year, Swegarden's statebound wrestlers shaved their heads prior to the state tournament in honor of the man who had lost all but a few wisps of hair to chemotherapy. At one point, Swegarden's fight for life included experimental treatments with Denver specialists, who declared him to be cancer-free. But the disease returned.

Swegarden made it to one wrestling meet in November, but he left school in mid-December to go home. Superintendent Wilfred Volesky said Swegarden stayed in school as long as he possibly could. "We knew that he wanted to be here and we loved him here," said Volesky. "When the time came when it would be too difficult, he let us know. It is tough to lose such a fine young man."

Swegarden's family has reserved a section of the gym for the hundreds of athletes whose lives were touched by the coach. Swegarden taught them the tough physical moves of a sport in which the athlete has only himself and his wits to depend upon. And he taught them about life. "He could help a kid when he was struggling," Wendo said. "He always preached acceptable behavior. There was no grunge look or wild haircuts on the kids. He had standards."

High school junior Corey Eisenbeis will be there Thursday to honor Swegarden as a friend, as a teacher, and as a coach. He was there when Swegarden took it upon himself to tell his wrestlers he was going home to be with his family. He remembers crying with the teammates. But Eisenbeis has the memories of good times with a great coach, who taught him wrestling and helped him chart the waters for sixteen and pre-teen years.

"He always told me to hang in there and do my best," Eisenbeis says. And there was one lesson for the coach to take with him. "He said when we get done with a match, even if we lose, we shouldn't be mad if we gave it our best."

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# Coyotes set goal, get it

Williston's wrestling team wanted to make a statement this week.

Saturday night they completed what they had to say. It ended in an exclamation point by the name of David Blonder.

Blonder, a 215-pound senior, won the 215-pound title via technical fall to conclude Williston's scoring in the state Class A Tournament.

The Coyote total of 170.5 was enough for a 33.5-point buffer on runner-up Fargo South.

South edged defending champion Bismarck 137-136 for second place and Jamestown took fourth with 129.

Valley City with 112 and Dickinson with 107 also broke the 100-point barrier.

Blonder was one of three Williston champions. Earlier, Bobby Triebull took 112-pound honors and Jared Nichols won at 152.

"I wasn't trying to put an exclamation point on it," said Blonder, who trounced Jamestown's 19-3 in 3:35. "I was just trying to get the win. There was no pressure on me because we already had it (the team championship).

Williston coach Chuck Michaelson, named coach of the year by his peers, said his team followed the blueprint it had laid out before the tournament. "They just did an excellent job," he said of his team." "We said going into this we had to have everyone score and everyone did."

Nine Coyotes placed. Brad Tofte (125) and Rick Waitman (171) finished second. Ryan Hegge (130) placed third. Alan Roness (135), Eric Hageman (160) and Matt Rossland (189) all took sixth.

Fargo South, Dickinson and Grand Forks Red River each boasted a pair of individual winners. Casey Becker, named Class A Mr. Wrestler, and Nick Fisher won at 135 and 145, respectively.

Marc Mellmer (103) and Josh Sayler (160) captured titles for Dickinson. Randy Gust (189) and Nathan Winkels (275) were Red River's champions.

Other championships went to Bismarck's Tony Bride (125), Minot's Derek Bischof (119), West Fargo's Jon Hanson (130), and Valley City's Philip Reidman (140).

Triebull (41-0), Sayler (47-0) and Gust (40-0) all finished the season undefeated. Sayler set a state record for victories and a Class A record for pins (35).

Becker and Bischof were repeat champions. Becker won at 130 last season and Bischof took 103-pound honors in 1996 and won at 112 in 1997. He was second at 119 last year.

Todd Huber of Bismarck (130) Zach Thumb of Fargo North (275) came up short in their repeat bids, falling in the finals.

Triebull said the Coyotes came into the state tournament feeling like they had to take care of unfinished business after last year's disappointing fourth-place state tourney showing.

"We wanted to beat Bismarck High so bad because last year they said it was a fluke when we beat them in a dual," he said.

Nichols also felt it was time to take care of business. "We've been real close to a state championship the last two years. Last year we fell short and this time we worked real hard for it, prepared and pulled it out at the end," he said.

Fargo South coach Lynn Forde said things had to break perfectly Saturday evening for the Bruins to finish second. "We had to get two wins and two majors to pass Bismarck and we got a little help from West Fargo in beating Huber," he said. "This was almost as fun as the year we won it (1997). I thought we wrestled about as well as we could have."

For Bismarck co-coach Jeff Schumacher, failing to repeat was tough to swallow. Williston's effort, however, made it tolerable. "Williston did an excellent job," he said. "We would have needed an outstanding tournament to beat Williston. They did a great job."




### Outlook for upcoming season...



# Outlook for upcoming season...

With only one returning state placer, the rebuilding process will continue at Grand Forks Central. Notable newcomers should include freshman Daniel White and Tony Batesole.


Key losses from last years team include Andy Zehren, Dave Hegland, Jay Roemmich and Travis Lorenz.

Obviously, we are excited about the new dual meet format with this team. However, we all know a lot can happen between November and February. It should be an exciting season for the Blue Jays and their fans.





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# Seven Keys to Maintaining a Healthy Weight

#### By JON GUNS

1. Don't Rely on Magic

No matter how much we would like it to be true, there is no magic way to achieve a healthy body weight. Many of the "magic" approaches – pills, powders and potions – can lead to significant weight loss for a short period. But the vast majority of people who lose weight this way loose respect for conditioning and hard work. They become lazy relying on the quick fix and have lots of trouble throughout wrestling season maintaining a healthy weight. It is what you do from now on and the rest of the season that will determine your success at maintaining a healthy weight.

2. I did it before I can do it again

Some believe that because you lost that amount of weight the year before (or your friend did) you think you can again. Remember that you as a high school or even a college wrestler are still growing. Naturally by working out you are putting on muscle and muscle weighs more that fat. As you grow you will naturally weigh more. Ask your self is it worth sacrificing muscle for weight, because that is what you are doing. A wrestler needs as much muscle as possible, don't sacrifice it.

3. Body Fat Check

Before you start your season get your body fat checked. The average body fat of young men is ~ 10% or less and the state requires that high school wrestlers do not cut their weigh below the 7% limit. Do the simple math, if you have 12% body fat the most you can loose is 5% of your weight. If you weigh 150 lbs. at 12% body fat this would suggest you loose only 7½ lbs. of body fat. While high schools in North Dakota don't take into consideration for the loss of water weight that colleges have. Colleges at the beginning of the season have each wrestler undergo a weight assessment using body weight, body composition and specific gravity of urine to determine weight at which the wrestler can compete, which consists of his lean body weight plus five percent. There will be no weight allowance ever. Colleges don't leave it up to the individuals to decide how low they can go.

4. Set Realistic Weight Goals

Achieving and maintaining a healthy weight is important for good health. But a healthy weight isn't necessarily the one that's suggested by a height/weight chart. Your healthy weight is what you weigh when you've empowered yourself to take care of your body through adequate activity and sensible eating. This means that you must make some sacrifices to get where you want to be. I suggest cutting out extra sweets, eliminating soda beverages (pop), and adding an extra workout in your schedule (like a morning run a couple times a week). This will increase your metabolism and you will naturally burn more calories.

#### 5. Have Fun

The key to burning fat is burning calories. The only way to significantly increase your body's caloric expenditure is to increase your level of activity. Unfortunately we've forgotten what most children know that exercise is fun! We have forgotten that exercise is an act of caring and self-respect, not work or punishment. Regular exercise is one of the few proven predictors of successful weight maintenance. Even more important, regular activity significantly reduces a long list of health risks. Coaches I ask you to break some practices up and remind wrestlers to have fun or it will make for a long season.

6. Get Stronger

I can't say it enough. Two wrestlers with the same ability step on to the mat and the one who gets his hand raised the most often is the stronger. Research has shown that resistance training – whether with weights, machines, elastic bands, even in water – does more than help with weight control. It makes you a more complete wrestler.

#### 7. Be Patient and Persistent

Being patient and persistent doesn't mean waiting for something to happen that will get you to a healthy body weight. It means planning and choosing attitudes that demonstrate self-acceptance and self-care. It takes practice. Most experts recommend that you keep some kind of record of your exercise, eating, and self-care habits. They don't have to be detailed or complicated. Just take a few minutes each day to note what activities you did to take care of yourself. Don't rush, I to 1½ lbs. a week weight loss is suggested by health officials. So start today, remember to take small steps. That's how most things happen...in real life.

Ashley-Wishek fans could thank their lucky stars that the team had five wrestlers going for championships Saturday night at the State Wrestling Tournament.

Otherwise it might have been a pretty boring night at the Bismarck Civic Center after their favorite sons locked up a second straight state championship earlier in the afternoon.

The team steamrolled to 173 points, well ahead of the second-place New Salem's 12.

The wrestling Goebel brothers, 112-pounder Jesse and 119-pounder Jerome, and 160-pounder Josh Hoffman, all won championships in front of 7,000 people.

Hoffman, a No. 4 seed, became the lowest-seeded wrestler in the tournament to win a title. "Seeding ain't anything," Hoffman said. "That's why you wrestle I just blocked that out and told myself I'm the best wrestler here."

That was a special moment for coach Perry Turner, as well. "To be a runner-up twice and finally succeed, I was very happy for him. He's a great kid," Turner said.

Ashley-Wishek's margin of victory was the largest since 1978. The 173 points was the most since 1981. New Salem actually had as many champion (three) as Ashley-Wishek, but not the depth. And Ashley-Wishek's depth began at the top.

Jerome had been to two title matches, but never wore a crown before Saturday when he pinned Brent Mrnak of Beach in 1:06.

How does it feel.

"I don't know yet," said Goebel, who finished the season 34-0. "I don't think it would come that fast."

Goebel;s winning move? "We call it the cow catcher at hoe," Goebel said.

The win came moments after his twin brother Jesse recorded his record 30th pin, sticking David Skoglund of Beach in 4:50. He finished the season 32-0.

"It's better than last year because of the record," Jesse said.

Jesse's thoughts, however, were with his brother. "I want it for him mor than me," he said, moments before Jerome's win.

Eleven Ashley-Wishek wrestlers qualified for state and eight placed in the top seven.

In addition to champions and runners-up Shane Eskelson at 140 and Travis Gleasman at 130, there was Ryan Wolf, who was seventh at 125 pounds, Darrik Nitschke, who was third at 135, and Dustn Thurn, who was third at 152.

"The kids in the wrestleback rounds took the pressure off the guys tonight," Turner said. "That made it easier. It was a tremendous effort.

It was the progression through the wrestlebacks that gave the team an insurmountable lead going into the finals.

Turner was able to relax and reflect during the championship matches.

"It's kind of like a situation with a child . . ."Turner said of Ashley-Wishek's title. "You love them dearly, but they're both special."

NOT SO FAST: It was reported Saturday that Danny Henderson of Hettinger broke Mark Pazdernik's pin record at 119 pounds. He, in fact, tied the mark of 25.

AWARDS: Hillsboro's Chris Mueller was named Class B Mr. Wrestler and New Town's Terry Mathson was named Coach of the Year.

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
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**End of Season Training Tips** 

By TERRY & TROY STEINER

It starts with a dream but without hard work and parparation, it also may end with a dream. Hold onto your dreams, but also get out there and do something about them.

Now that you have built a great base of conditioning through the early and mid parts of your season, it is time to start gearing everything for the end of the season. This is a time in which workouts should be designed to bring out your highest level of intensity. Conditioning and endurance is already with you at this point so now you have to work on sharpness and explosion.

Skill Development: Always try to correct your lesser strengths (I do not like to think of it as weaknesses) and continue to build on your strengths. In wrestling practices when you are drilling and reviewing your technique, make sure that you are drilling everything with aloit of explosion and preciseness. Trying to emulate a match as close as possible. Spend 20-30 minutes drilling your technique, in the areas that you have found yourself in during matches thus far in the season. Because chances are you will find yourselves in the same situations and you have to be able to put points up on the scoreboard. After you are thoroughly warmed up, wrestle shorter periods. Because they are shorter, the intensity needs to pick up. The periods of match

length are good, but even go 1 minute periods and 30 second periods where you must score. You can also put yourself in different situations in which you are losing by 1, 2, 3, or 4 points with 30 sec. @ndash; 1 min. remaining. Then put your self ahead by 1, 2, 3, or 4 points and hold good position. Score when a situation presents itself but do not give your opponent anything to work with.

Conditioning: You already have a good aerobic conditioning base built up, now it is time to work on your anaerobic conditioning. This will be done by short intense bursts at your highest intensity. Wrestling live situations can do it as I have stated above and also by running sprints. Running 440, 220, 100 and 50's can do wonders. Make sure and give yourself some rest in-between each sprint about the same amount of time it took you to run the spring.

Strength Training: It is crucial to keep your strength now towards to end of the season. Try to life heavy weights with 6-8 repetitions 1-2 times a week and a circuit type of lift with lighter weights and 10-15 repetitions 1 times a week. This is something you will have to arrange around your competition schedule. Make sure to give yourself 36 hours to recover from your lifts before your competition, but do not neglect this area of your training.

Nutrition and Rest: This could be the most important aspect for peaking at the right time. You should be giving your body nutritious meals at least 3-4 times a day. Make sure to spread your calories out throughout the day. Do not starve your bodies of calories because you must feed your muscles for energy and recovery. Giving your muscles and body adequate rest is very important. If they are not properly rested, they will not perform at optimum levels. You should feel refreshed and ready to explode into your workouts. If you do not feel right, chances are your body needs more nutrients or rest. Listen to your body.

Mental Skills Training: Affirmations are little notes to yourself telling you exactly what you want to happen. Write your affirmations in the present tense. Your mind doesn't know what is true or false. It just takes in information like a computer. So, If you tell it things you want to happen you will move in that direction. Example:

My double leg is explosive!

I always finish my single leg perfect!

I always perform my best in matches!

I am the 1999 State Champion at 145 pounds.

Look at your affirmations a few times a day and say them to yourself. You will see results, just by convincing your mind what you want to happen.

#### Quantity or Quality, that is the Question

National Wrestling Rules that expanded the number of weight classes from 12 to 14 didn't keep states like North Dakota in mind. Dwindling rural population and school enrollments are greatly affecting wrestling viability in our small communities. Some school administrations/boards have dropped their wrestling program because they could no longer field a full team. (Mostly important in duels) It is unlikely that more than 10 teams in North Dakota class "B" wrestling will be able to field a full team. Duel team championships and a possible multiple team champion is a mistake in my opinion. It most certainly will favor larger enrollment schools and not place a premium on quality as championships that are based on a point system crowning individual state champs, runner-ups and consolation matches. In class "B" wrestling, when the old format is used, a small school with five or six quality wrestlers could win a state championship. I believe that's how it should be. Rewarding larger enrollment schools with state championships for forfeits is a sham if not a shame. I can visualize a duel championship won by a wrestler with a 2-20 record by virtue of a forfeit, winning a state championship for his school. If that wouldn't make my food regurgitate, nothing else could. If state championships aren't for rewarding excellence then what are they? The idea of having two state championships is good in theory only. If numbers should determine a state championship then why not allow any school to enter as many participants in each weight class as they want to. This echo may be redundant but simple logic should prevail and convince wrestling purists why duel championships shouldn't crown a state champion. I believe it will be detrimental to wrestling and take away from the idea of rewarding quality & excellence. It is well-known fact that more than 70% of the teams cannot field a competitive duel team because of small enrollments.

If the aforementioned hypothetical don't occur then enters scenario number two. During the dominant years of Watford City, Velva, Lisbon, Napoleon and Carrington chances are most years they would have won both championships. (One championship is enough) I strongly believe the idea of duel championships is flawed & and not necessary for the state of North Dakota. In class "A" there are only 20 teams. It becomes evident that wrestling state consolation matches down to seven & eight places already makes the state championship similar to a duel format championship. This allows nearly half of the wrestlers in the state to place. In my view two championships per division cheapens wrestling. If you're looking at two championships as good, why not three or four like in boxing, so you could have a championship for everybody

In the long run, if I am proved wrong, it will make me glad, after all, wrestling is for development for our kids. If the end result doesn't slight the sports integrity and allows the smaller school to compete then I will have been proven wrong. I hope that I'm not right again!

It has been many years since the overall quality of wrestling in North Dakota has been at this mediocre level, not just through my eyes but also how poorly we have done against out of state competition. I'd hate to think we are awarding two championships of inferior quality.

In conclusion and summary, administrators/boards need to know or be educated that it is important for schools to have wrestling programs, even if they have nine or 10 wrestlers. In track & field it has long been recognized that quality supercedes numbers. Some track teams may have good relay teams and no hurdlers, shot putters or high jumpers. Some track teams may have sprinters where one individual may win both the 100 & 200-meter sprints. In track & field, programs are not eliminated because they don't have participants in all events. Wrestling should be viewed similarly as a viable and worthwhile sport, even if not all the weight classes are filled.

Last but not least, I am for anything that can make North Dakota wrestling flourish, I'm especially worried about wrestling in the small enrollment schools because once it's gone it's gone forever. Many fans would be surprised how much enrollments have dropped in most rural communities. Many schools, according to the NDHSAA booklet have less than 70 boys in high school. These schools need a very high percentage of participation to field both basketball & wrestling teams. It takes a relentless effort to field a team and be competitive against larger schools. Especially, in duel competition where different size individuals are required. This makes one realize the room for error is small and getting smaller every year. I would like to commend everyone that is making a difference for wrestling. It is my earnest wish throughout North Dakota from Walhalla to Bowman and from Wahpeton to Williston that wrestling will remain with us. Somewhere in the future let it be said, that we did what we could and that quality wasn't sold-out for quantity...

#### Outlook for upcoming season...





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
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#### Ex-Fargo Wrestler One of the Nations Best Coaches

Hopefully, most of you have not forgotten this North Dakota wrestler.


Listen to these stats and think to yourself who this might be, then read about this man. In my opinion, he will soon be one of North Dakota's Hall of Fame wrestlers/coaches.

He was a three-time finalist and two time North Dakota state champion. He was an 11 time All-American while at Fargo South High School and NDSU. He made the Greco Roman Olympic Cut Finals in 1980 and 1984. In 1984, he was a shoe in to be the Olympic participant. He was No. 1 on the ladder before a knee injury left him short of his long time dream. He has most recently coached two high school teams that were ranked in the top 10 in the Nation 8th in 1998 and 7th in 1999 for Unitah High School in Vernal Utah. He also has started a tournament that brings in schools from all across the upper Midwest. In the USA Wrestling Magazine it was ranked as one of the top 20 toughest wrestling tournaments in the nation.

This great wrestler and coach is Greg Stensgard. Greg moved to Vernal, Utah four years ago after assisting Bucky Maughan at NDSU the twelve years previous.

Over the last four years in Vernal, Utah Greg's teams have placed 3rd in 1996, 2nd in 1997, and back to back State Championships in 1998 and 1999. Topping off his great 1999-wrestling season Greg was named the Utah Coach of the Year, for all classes 2A-5A.

Greg has been married for two years to his wife Stephanie, and has two daughters Stevie and Summer. I wish him the best and hope to see him soon in the North Dakota Hall of Fame with all the other great Wrestlers and Coaches.

This year the Cadet Nationals hosted over 1500 competitors from 50 states. This tournament showcases the best 15-16-


year-olds in the nation!



#### **Basic Ankle Strapping**

- 1-The athlete's skin has been prepared in the usual manner and a layer of J-WRAP\* Pretaping Underwrap has been applied. 11/2" width tape will be used, although as the taper becomes more proficient, 2" may be used on individuals with larger ankles. The athlete is positioned comfortably on the table, the leg extended, the foot in neutral (neither turned in nor out) and dorsiflexed (toes to nose) slightly to approximately
- 2-The first strip of tape has been applied around the leg above the ankle. It's the first of two anchor strips. The leg at this point is not cylindrically shaped; therefore, the tape must be angled slightly. This slight angling allows the tape to conform smoothly to the shape of the leg.
- 3-Two more anchors are applied at the instep; the first is applied over the hook of the fifth metatarsal. The tape is applied quite snugly, but not so tightly as to compromise circulation, or exert undue pressure on the hook of the fifth metalarsal.
- 4-Care must be exercised here that the tension is not so great as to cause discomfort to the athlete when walking, during running, in practice or a game situation. The overlap in adhesive taping is usually one-half to two-thirds of the previous strip. The two upper anchors and two lower anchors have been applied. This delineates the area of the preventive ankle taping.
- 5-The first stirrup strip is applied. It begins on the medial (inside) aspect of the ankle and continues down, over and behind the medial malleolus, under the foot and arch, up the lateral (outside) aspect of the foot, over and behind the lateral malleolus, and torn off at the upper anchor.
- 6-The first horizontal strip is started on the medial (inside) aspect of the lower anchor, carried over and below the medial malleolus, behind the Achilles tendon...
- 7-brought around the ankle to over and below the lateral malleolus, carried across the dorsum (upper part) of the foot, and torn off where the strip was started...we now have one stirrup and one horizontal strip applied.
- 8-Successive sets of interlocking stirrups and horizontal strips are applied, again overlapping the tape one-half to two-thirds of its width. The tape should be in smooth conformity with a little wrinkling, with snug tension, all pieces overlapped and joined. We see now the completed portion of the closed basket weave with four sets of interlocking stirrups and horizontal strips.
- 9-The heel lock strip is begun by attaching the tape to the lateral (outside) aspect of the heel, coming across the dorsum (top) of the loot...
- 10-angling underneath the arch to come up on





















the outside of the heel, progress behind the heel to come up over and above the medial mallegus.

11-traverse around the ankle and then come down the inside of the heel to come under the arch up just anterior to the lateral malleolus.

12-Continue around the ankle and back to our starting point, to begin the spiral up the leg.

13-The spiral is completed and the tape is forn off. What we have done with this strip of tape is given a lateral heel lock to our closed basket weave. The tape then is continued up in spiral lashion until we have passed the portion of the lower leg that is a cylinder.

14-A new strip is applied in the angle fashion at the upper end of the taping procedure. This is a finish strip that lies in all of the ends. For additional support, more heel locks may be applied. In fact, a medial heel lock may be utilized, beginning on the medial aspect of the heel and using the same pattern as the lateral heel lock but in a reverse manner.

#### Combination Elastic and Nonelastic Tape Ankle Strapping

A second method of ankle laping is being demonstrated and that is the use of a combination of elastic tape and nonelastic tape. This taping procedure is useful where a great deal of control is not necessary. It is used for an overnight compression period or for the normal activities of daily living.

1-The skin has been prepared as usual, the tape adherent applied and a layer of underwrap material wrapped over the extremity for the entire course of the taping procedure. A LITE-FLEX™ Elastic Tape anchor is applied at the upper portion of the foot.

2-We then use nonelastic ZONAS\* Tape, beginning on the medial aspect and applying a series of three or four stirrups. Care was exercised that the stirrup strips did not come over the hook of the lifth metatarsal, and we see also that the last two stirrup strips were angled slightly forward to lift the contours of the leg and allow the tape to be applied smoothly.

3-An elastic tape anchor is applied at the arch. It's begun over the hook of the filth metalarsal.

4- proceeds around the ankle to the lateral (outside) aspect of the heet, coming across the dorsum (top) of the foot, completing a heef lock. Additional heef-lock patterns may be performed if additional protection is desired.

5-The elastic tape is then spiralled up the leg to the lop of the underwrap where it is forn off.



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



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## North Dakota State University Wrestling Preview

Keyed by two-time All-American Steve Saxlund, who has appeared in the national title bout the past two seasons, and three other All-Americans, North Dakota State University wrestling is poised to rebound from a disappointing 98-99 tournament run.

Wrestling is a proud and storied program at NDSU with 14 conference titles in the last 20 years and national titles in 1988 and 1998 but the finish to the 1999 season was not one to cherish.

The Bison qualified six wrestlers for the '99 NCAA National Championships but finished a distant seventh after falling by one point in defense of their North Central Conference crown two weeks earlier.

Three All-Americans return from that group of qualifiers in Kris Nelson (Lisbon, N.D. @ 133), Steve Saxlund (Pipestone, Minn. @ 174 lbs.) and Wayne Mooney (Greenbush, Minn. @ 157 lbs.) to form the backbone of the 1999-2000 North Dakota State squad along with 1998 All-American Dave Clymer (Hastings, Minn. @ Hwt.).

Veteran head coach Bucky Maughan, opening his 36th season at the helm of the Bison, expects Saxlund be a team leader for the Thundering Herd. Saxlund is 51-10 over his first two years with two conference titles, one national championship, and one runner-

up national finish.

There are several other returning grapplers with varsity experience who must step it up and get the job done if the Bison are to be successful.

Coach Maughan expects big seasons from Jake Thielbar (Fairbault, Minn. @ 141 lbs.), Todd Fuller (Maple Lake, Minn. @ 165 lbs.), Bryan Mueller (Hillsboro, N.D. @ 197 lbs.) and Nick Severson (Hayfield, Minn. @ 197 lbs.). "They have all shown tremendous talent and are our future leaders and national contenders," said Maughan. "Now is the time for them to step up to the front."

Other wrestlers who will have the chance to be contenders for NDSU are Chris Moen (Grand Rapids, Minn. @ 184 lbs.), Kyle Pieper (Mountain Lake, Minn. @ 133 lbs.), Chris Rufo (Moanalua, Hawaii. @ 174 lbs.), Grady Wolf (Bismarck, N.D. @ 157 lbs.) and Lance Wurm (Maple Lake, Minn. @ 149 lbs.). "This group of wrestlers have a couple of years of open tournament experience and are ready for 'Prime Time' exposure," said Maughan.

With a strong group of redshirts and excellent freshman and transfer classes, who will challenge the veterans for mat time, the

Bison should contend for NCC and NCAA championships.

## University of Mary Wrestling Preview

Continuing its strong presence in NAIA wrestling, the 1998-99 Marauder wrestling team captured its ninth consecutive conference title and advanced 12 wrestlers to take sixth place at the NAIA National Tournament.

All of the Marauders return from last year's team, making this season look very promising as U-Mary hunts for the national title. Returning All-Americans include Jeremy Engelhardt, national champion at 174 lbs.; Pat Runex, second at 125 lbs.; Brian

Zehren, third at 141 lbs.; Justine Currie, fifth at 157 lbs.; and Jason Hatchett, eighth at 184 lbs.

The Marauders will be aided by their strong recruiting class, Randy Gust, the 1999 North Dakota State Champion (197); Aaron Hartnell, two-time Montana State Champion and second at the National High School Meet (125); Nick Holwegner, North Dakota State Champion (149); Sammy Reyna, fourth place finisher at the California Greco Championships; Ryan Weigel, second place (149) at the North Dakota State Championships; and Danny Williams, three-time North Dakota State Placer and eighth place winner at the Greco Nationals.

"This team is the best I've had in terms of self-motivation. They hit the weights on their own and are very self-driven." Says Head Coach Milo Trusty. "This team is young but solid - they will grow into something big.

This season marks the thirteenth year for the U-Mary program and Trusty has his sights set on the national title.

#### Milo Trusty Head Coach

Head Coach Milo Trusty enters his thirteenth season with the U-Mary wrestling program. Under his leadership, he has guided 50 All-Americans, nine national champions, and watched his teams go 110-10 overall in duals.

Trusty says the Marauders' success boils down to a strong work ethic. "Our wrestlers want to succeed and are willing to put in the work. By the end of the year, the guys are like a family because they have to work together to get through the workouts and through the season. They work together to reach their daily goals throughout the season.'

A former wrestling standout at Valley City State University, Trusty's coaching experience includes stints at Bismarck and Century High Schools, Bismarck State College, and Umpqua Community College in Oregon. He founded Mat Pac wrestling in 1978, a youth wrestling program that has produced over 400 state champions and more than 100 national and regional champions.


